

Educational offer of the Doctoral School of the Koszalin University of Technology

The Doctoral School of the Koszalin University of Technology prepares doctoral students for obtaining a doctoral degree in the field of engineering and technology in three disciplines:

- Automation, electronic and electrical engineering,
- Mechanical engineering,
- Civil engineering and transport.

A person holding a Master's degree, a Master's of Science degree or an equivalent degree may be admitted to a Doctoral School. Admission of a candidate to the Doctoral School takes place through competition and is based on the results of the recruitment procedure referred to in Admission Rules to the Doctoral School of the Koszalin University of Technology. Admission rules in the academic year 2021/2022 are published on the website at (*https://tu.koszalin.pl/ckeditor_assets/attachments/3105/admission_rules.pdf*).

Candidates from Poland and abroad can apply to the Doctoral School. Before the recruitment, candidates are obliged to choose a potential PhD supervisor and prepare an outline of a research project. A list of research topics is placed on the website at (*https://szkoladoktorska.tu.koszalin.pl*). Candidates submit a set of documents specified in admission rules (*https://tu.koszalin.pl/ckeditor_assets/attachments/3105/admission_rules.pdf*). In case of foreign university diplomas a candidate must submit a document of foreign diploma recognition issued by the Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange (*https://nawa.gov.pl/*). Moreover, foreigners admitted to the Doctoral School must present upon their arrival at the Koszalin University of Technology confirmation of a legal stay on the territory of the Republic of Poland and confirmation of health insurance.

Education in the Doctoral School lasts 8 semesters and is carried out on the basis of a doctoral training and individual research plan. The education programme in the Doctoral School comprises 540 hours and 216 ECTS points. Courses within the chosen disciplines are elective courses in the amount of 30 hours and 4 ECTS points per semester. Candidates from abroad admitted to the Doctoral School of the Koszalin University of Technology receive a doctoral scholarship whose amount is determined by The Law on Higher Education and Science Act. Candidates from abroad can also apply for accommodation in a student dormitory.
